"Refresher Training on Management of Pre-ART/ART for Adult Clinicians and Pediatricians"

01-05 May 2017 at National Pediatric Hospital

1. Background and Rational:

Cambodia has been successful in the fight against HIV and AIDS, which marks by the recognition of UNAIDS for the MDG 6. This is a big country accomplishment with a national strong leadership and joint work between national program and stakeholders. The current effort in the country follows the global commitment towards ending AIDS by 2030; however, reaching the third 90 of the HIV cascade remains a challenge (retain PLHIVs in care and have their VL suppressed). After the dissemination of newly revised guideline for adults, adolescents, and children in November 2016, this initiative hopefully will enable the HIV care and treatment more efficacy.

The refresher trainings will provide the adult Pre-ART/ART and PAC team leaders and members the newly updated management of OIs/ART.

The refresher training is organized by NCHADS, and funded by WHO.

2. Objectives:

- To ensure that they have up-to-date skill and knowledge in HIV Care and treatment, so that they can provide quality care and treatment services for PLHIV.
- 2. To share experiences to response to the HIV infection in adults and pediatric patients including OI and ART, adherence, psychological support, management of treatment failure.

In total, there were 28 participants. NCHADS have invited participants from National pediatric Hospital: 2 but they were absent.

7. Outcomes

Following the newly revised curriculum of the refresher training; the trainers have covered the topic on:

- New criteria on ART initiation "Treat All", provide ART immediately after HIV detection, and enrollment
- Cryptococcus antigen screening and fluconazole prophylaxis
- Management of HIV-HBV or/and HCV co-infection: How to provide the regimen, and follow-up after treatment.
- New recommendation on IPT prophylaxis, and TB treatment and Management
- The revision on the management of OIs and prophylaxis
- PMTCT and EID
- New VL algorithm
- Treatment failure and the management
- Introduction to Intergrade inhibitor and other Protease Inhibitor that will be available in Cambodia for the purpose of Salvage therapy of patients failed to 2nd line
- Non-communicable disease and the prevention

During these 5 days: the trainers actively discuss relevant issues in each presentation followed by experiences and practices sharing that enabled participants to be well equipped with sufficient knowledge to provide better quality of HIV care and treatment.

Participants' knowledge was significantly increased from the range of 55% to 78% at pre-test to 82% to 100% at post-test.

The team discussed the new recommendation of OIs prophylaxis that the criteria for start, continue and stop of the Cotrim and Fluconazole are very challenging. There will be an increase demand for cotrim, but the stock of cotrim at the sites is limited, and not sufficient to all children patients. The stock of fluconazole is also limited at the site.

Another challenges raised by the participants regarding TB prophylaxis using Isoniazid. At Chhouk Sar Clinic, they have one patient already been on IPT for 5 months until now, then the patient was diagnosed with TB, the physicians started TB treatment, and the question is will the physician need to provide IPT again after finish the TB treatment? Team had shared most of their experiences and practices at the site. However, the recommendation in the guideline is that, if the interruption less than 8 weeks, they should continue the IPT in total period of 6 month prophylaxis. If the interruption is more than 8 weeks, the physicians should restart the IPT for another 6 months as stated in the guideline.

During the session of CMV Retinitis, presented by Dr. Thong, the sites reported that they had a few cases of blindness probably caused by CMV. The team discussed how the sites could refer them to have proper management and treatment for the CMV retinitis. They had shared information and experiences regarding the cases. Dr. Phe Thong suggests 3 places that the sites could refer for eyes checked and treatment including, Centre of Hope, Takoe Eyes Center and Ang Doung Hospital. However, the sites should prepare all the patients documents and good referral documents in order for physicians at Centre of Hope could understand their status and could follow-up the cases most effectively, and make sure the patients have enough financial support to stay longer in Phnom Penh for a period of treatment.

8. Conclusion

The refresher training was successfully conducted, participant gained their knowledge compare to pre-test and reached the objectives.
