

## Quarterly Boosted Continuum of Prevention to Care and Treatment (BCOPCT)

Quarter 2<sup>nd</sup> 2022

Behavior Change Communication (BCC) and Data Management Unit (DMU) of NCHADS organize its routine quarterly meeting on the boosted continuum of prevention to care and treatment to review the progress of the prevention and testing performance of all NCHADS's partners who implementing HIV prevention with key population. The meeting participated from representative from KHANA, RHAC, MHC, MHSS, CWP, FI, and AHF as well as key technical partners from UNAIDS, WHO and EpiC project of the FHI360.

There five key presentations from RHAC, KHANA, AHF, FI and NCHADS presented during the meeting and discussion. Key content of the presentation and discussion includes coverage of KP, key interventions, reaching and testing by modality, and key challenges. Based on the presentation there are some key actions below:

- Improve and expand the HIVST among KPs and its partner (data show that partner of FEW tested positive through HIVST through FEW). BCC and VCCT will facilitate with logistic of NCHADS to ensure SSI/SSSI have sufficient test kits for using.
- Few cases tested reactive and not able to do confirmation test due stock out of confirm test in some sites including Chhouk Sar. NCHADS will try its best to facilitate the process to ensure sites have enough test.
- PrEP uptake among KP especially MSM and TG among tested negative somewhat increased, however, it still small proportion among total tested negative – so the detail discussion among key players on how to maximize PrEP uptake.
- The yield of HIV testing through virtual outreach and PID+ modality was high compared to other modality, so more investment should be made to maximize these two modalities.
