

Regional workshop to review the results and continuous quality improvement of HIV case finding, prevention, care and treatment services towards the national targets of 95.95.95.



The National Center for HIV/AIDS, Dermatology, and STDs organized a regional workshop titled "Regional workshop to review the results and continuous quality improvement of HIV case finding, prevention, care and treatment services towards the national targets of 95.95.95." The event took place on May 19-20, 2025, at the Takeo Provincial Health Department, supported financially and technically by the US-CDC Cambodia program. The workshop

aimed to ensure high-quality and balanced outcomes across the entire process, from identifying HIV-positive individuals to enrolling them in comprehensive care and treatment services. Presided over by **Professor Assistant Ouk Vichea**, Head of the National Center, **Pharmacist Phan Van**, Head of the Takeo Provincial Health Department, and **Dr. Chan Sodara**, Representative of US-CDC Cambodia, the event featured opening remarks and discussions.

The 52 attendees included specialists from the National Center's departments—AIDS Care, Behavior Change Communication (BCC), Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI), Laboratory, Data Management Unit (DMU), Voluntary Counseling and Testing (VCCT), Technical Bureau, and the NCHADS Clinic—along with heads of provincial HIV/AIDS programs, ART team leaders from various provinces, and partner organizations such as MHC, CWPD and PC. Key



presentations addressed progress toward the First 95 Goal, including the number of newly detected HIV-positive cases, enrollment rates into ART services, and HIV self-testing (HIVST) confirmation results. Discussions also covered the Second and Third 95 Goals, reviewing ART patient mortality rates, missed follow-ups, lost-to-follow-up cases reinstated into care, appointment adherence, medication stock delays, priority challenges affecting performance indicators, and strategic action plans for improvement.
